Discharge Instructions For: Cataracts/Clear Lens Exchange/Implantable Contact Lens/Intacs.

- 1. Do not drive a car, operate any machinery or power tools, drink any alcoholic beverages, or make any important decisions for at least 18 hours following your procedure.
- 2. You may resume normal, non-strenuous activities after surgery. No bending or lifting over 20 pounds for the next 24 hours. Also continue taking all your normal medications, as well as normal diet.
- 3. Avoid direct trauma to your eye. Do not rub your eye or apply pressure. Tape the plastic shield over your eye before you go to bed each night for 7 nights to avoid accidental rubbing or bumping of the eye.
- 4. You may have had an IV placed today. It is normal for the site to be sore, bruised, or swollen. Warm compresses may be applied to help with these symptoms.
- 5. Patients may read, watch TV, or use the computer for the day following surgery.
- 6. You may shower, shave and wash hair starting the day after surgery, but avoid getting water in the eye for the first week. No eye make-up for one week following surgery.
- 7. There are no restrictions on sexual activities.
- 8. Wear your sunglasses upon discharge from the facility and anytime you are outside during the next week. They may be worn indoors if desired.
- 9. You may swim after one week, but no diving or scuba diving for four weeks.
- 10. During the typical healing period after surgery, it is normal to experience a sandy, gritty feeling in the eye. Your eye may tear or feel dry. It is also normal for your vision to be blurry and/or to see floaters during the healing period. The healing period will typically last 1 to 3 weeks and symptoms should improve gradually during this period.
- 11. Tylenol or aspirin products may be taken for mild discomfort. If you develop severe pain that is unrelieved by these products, or is accompanied by nausea/vomiting or loss of vision, please call the Cleveland Eye Clinic immediately, or go to the nearest emergency room, or call 911.
- 12. Your doctor will instruct you, at your follow-up visit, about your regular glasses. You may need glasses for best vision depending on which surgery package you chose.
